Mexican Restaurant Spicy Carrots

Scott has always loved the spicy pickled carrots served at Mexican restaurants. When we were newlyweds, I wrote to a weekly cooking advice column in the newspaper requesting a recipe, and they printed my letter with the version from Guadalajara Restaurant in Lake Elsinore. These are good and so easy to make.



Ingredients:

- 2-4 T olive oil
- 2 cloves garlic
- 10 carrots, sliced
- 1 onion, cut into chunks
- Pinch oregano
- Pinch salt & pepper
- 2 bay leaves
- ¼ to ½ c vinegar
- 12 slices jalapeno pepper

Directions:

Saute garlic cloves in olive oil until golden brown and soft enough to smash with a spoon. Add sliced carrots and onion chunks; saute until al dente, about 10 minutes. Add oregano, salt, pepper, and bay leaves and stir to mix. Add vinegar and continue heating until vinegar bubbles. Remove from heat and let cool for 10 minutes. Put into a bowl and add jalapeno slices. Store in refrigerator overnight.

Apple Cranberry Crisp Recipe:

Ingredients:

•For topping:

- 1/3 cup (40gr) all-purpose flour
- 1/4 cup (40gr) packed light brown sugar
- 1/4 cup (50gr) sugar
- 1/4 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1/4 teaspoon ground nutmeg (preferably freshly grated)
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 5 tablespoons (70gr) unsalted butter, chilled and cut into small cubes
- 1/2 cup (60gr) pecan halves
- 1/2 cup (50gr) slivered almonds

For filling:

- 2lbs (1kg) apples* (recommend Honeycrisp and Golden Delicious)
- 1 cup (100gr) cranberries, fresh or frozen
- 1/2 cup (100gr) sugar
- 1 1/2 tablespoon freshly squeezed lemon juice
- Zest of 1 lemon



Directions:

1. In a food processor, combine flour, sugars, cinnamon, nutmeg and salt. Pulse until combined. Add butter and pulse for about a minute or so, or until the mixture is crumbly. Add nuts and pulse a few more times. The mixture should look like wet sand with small chunks of nut. Refrigerate the mixture while preparing the filling.
2. Preheat the oven to 375°F (190°C).
3. Peel and quarter the apples. Cut out the core and slice into flat chunks.
4. In a medium bowl, mix together apples, cranberries, sugar, lemon juice and zest. Pour the fruit mixture into 8-in (20cm) square dish, or 9-in (23cm) round deep pie pan. Evenly spread the topping over the fruit mixture.
5. Bake for 40-45 minutes, or until the topping is the golden brown and the filling is bubbling. Serve warm with whipped cream or vanilla ice cream.

DIY Mini Paper Pumpkin Lanterns:

Supplies:

- Black Cardstock
- Glue Dots or Hot Glue
- Orange, Yellow, Purple, or White Tissue Paper
- Silhouette Cameo or Cricut cutting machine



Directions:

1. Cut out your design onto cardstock. I chose to make my small but you can make them as big or as little as you'd like!
2. Cut small strips of tissue paper and use glue dots to attach the tissue paper to the backside of your lantern.
3. Fold each side of your design (fold it in fourths!) and also where your dashed lines are.
4. Place glue on the flaps of your lantern to hold the sides together. You should also put glue on the bottom flaps so that when you fold everything together you can close the bottom!
5. If your lanterns are big enough you can put a small tea light in the middle to give it an eerie glow for your Halloween party!

First a vehicle that is part of the estate must be documented and the following information is what you will need to complete the paperwork for any vehicle that is part of the probate estate. - VIN number for each vehicle
- License plate number for each vehicle
- Mileage and condition of each car
- Year, make and model of each car
- If possible, pictures of the exterior and interior of each vehicle
- Only include vehicles titled in just the deceased person's name alone
